The performance "Water – Nectar of the Gods", directed by Candice de Rozario, was specially created by TLC to launch "World Water Day" at the Marina Barrage in March this year. TLC was invited to re-stage this show at the AFCC event. While the overarching message is one of conservation and sustainability, our show is about the celebration of the power, beauty and majesty of water, and how it is truly the lifeblood of our planet. Several books about water written by local and foreign authors were carefully selected to create this magical performance. These stories were told through acting, dance, movement, mask and puppetry, and peppered with excerpts from poems by both local and overseas writers, primarily from *WATER*, by Christopher Cheng and Susanna Goho-Quek



Storybook Theatre Holiday Workshops



TLC conducted English and Chinese holiday workshops for children (aged 3-6 years) at various preschools this November and December to bring books by award-winning children's book authors like Emily Lim, Sarah Mounsey and Linn Shekinah to life. The workshops took children on a dramatic journey that integrate and combine storytelling and drama techniques in multiple ways to support children's learning through the arts. Through drama, visual arts, music and movements, children will gain confidence as they explore new learning and internalization of language and skills in enjoyable and creative ways.

Arts education helps students with increased awareness of self (mind, body and voice) and others (collaboration and empathy); improved clarity and creativity in communication of ideas; and fosters a deep understanding of human behavior, motivation, diversity, culture and history.

Ng Hui will be a member of TLC's team!




Ng Hui is a multi-talented artiste who acts and hosts on TV. She is effectively bilingual and is also actively involved in the theatre/stage circle. Ng Hui earned her first acting nomination at Star Awards '07 in the category of Best Supporting Actress for her role in **"The Greatest Love Of All"**. The thespian further proved her natural acting ability in 2009 when she snagged the Star Awards Best Supporting Actress Award and The New Paper Most Breakthrough Performance of the Year Award for her breakthrough performance as the long-suffering maid *Ah Tao* in the award-winning drama **"The Little Nyonya"**. She went on to garner another Best Supporting Actress Nomination for playing an evil, scheming woman in **"Kampung Ties"**. In addition to performing, Ng Hui was also the acting head of drama and teacher at NAFSA's School of Young Talents. Integrated Arts Training for Preschool Teachers!

TLC will be offering arts training for preschool teachers in Drama, Music & Movement and Visual Arts to be integrated into the school curriculum. This 12-week program will be offered from July 2015!

The training is designed to provide educators with the tools to use the arts as a medium to engage children. As the arts are introduced into the curriculum, the arts become a new way of teaching, learning and knowing.

LAVINA CHONG – MUSIC & MOVEMENT

Lavina's work in the field of Early Childhood Education date back to 1990. She attained Masters in Science (Early Childhood Education) from Wheelock College, Boston in 2003 and has professional qualifications in Music, Yogakids, Speech and Drama and Storytelling. Lavina has worked in several reputable preschools in Singapore and specialises in areas such as Infant-Toddler Education, Language Arts for the young children, Music Movement and Drama for children. Lavina also ran Kids' Loft (a parent-toddler playschool) for 7 years (2003-2010). She is presently an adjunct lecturer with SEED Institute and Wheelock College, Singapore.

WONG SEET FUN – VISUAL ARTS

Wong Seet Fun is an artist and an early childhood educator. The founder of Art Loft, she is also an Adjunct Lecturer with SEED Institute, Nanyang Management, Ngee Ann Polytechnic and co-teaches "The Creative Arts" module. The objective of Art Loft is to help the child develop an awareness of the environment, nurture creativity and provide for an all rounded education.

Through arts education, very young children can experience nontraditional modes of learning that develop intrapersonal, interpersonal, spatial, kinesthetic, and logic abilities, skills, and knowledge, as well as traditional modes of learning that develop mathematical and linguistic abilities, skills and knowledge. As children learn in multiple ways, activities should reflect these multiple ways of knowing and doing.
